Major Administrative and Scientific Interests:

My primary clinical interest has been the prevention and early treatment of heritable illnesses that have their onset in childhood. I originally studied risk and protective factors associated with prevention of the onset of asthma. Subsequently, I have focused on the evaluation and treatment of juvenile onset bipolar disorder. This included the development of early screening protocols designed to identify children at risk for early illnesses who would be most likely to benefit from selective and targeted preventive interventions. Since coming to the Mayo Clinic, I have made a major commitment to investigating pharmacogenomic characteristics of psychotropic medications. In 2004, I initiated a major effort to better understand the genomic basis of addictions.

My research interests originally evolved within the context of understanding the emotional development of young children with a special focus on the prevention of the onset of physical and emotional disorders. Initially I studied populations of infants and preschool children who were at risk for abnormal emotional development. These studies included young children who had been physically abused or whose parents had received atypical early parenting. Subsequently, I focused my studies on examining the early emotional development of physically ill children and particularly the impact of severe life threatening asthma on the development of children with asthma and their families.

A major research effort has been the design and implementation of a prospective longitudinal study examining the relative contributions of ten etiological factors to the onset of asthma in a group of genetically at risk children. This study represents the first major research effort designed to define the effect of stress on susceptibility to asthma or allergic illness in genetically vulnerable infants. This longitudinal study has continued for the past twenty years and is currently being conducted by Dr. Mary Klinnert who is still at The National Jewish Medical and Research Center. We subsequently initiated a large intervention project with 140 families. The objective was to prevent or delay asthma and allergy in a group of genetically at risk children. This study compared the relative effects of an educational intervention, dietary counseling, and a psychologically oriented home intervention and was the first randomized controlled trial of these contrasting interventions in this at risk population.

My research interests have broadened to include the study of a variety of genetically mediated illnesses with a specific focus on the examination of the effects of environmental influences on gene expression. At the George Washington University, we explored these interactions by conducting a double blind randomized controlled placebo trial of valproic acid to treat the prodromal symptoms of bipolar disorder in children at genetic risk.

On coming to the Mayo Clinic in September 2000, my primary goal has been to link the clinical service system with the highly developed capacity to systematically establish genotypic variability available at the Clinic. In 2002, we began work on the development of pharmacogenomic screening of patients taking psychotropic medications using new microarrays designed to assess genotypic variability resulting in atypical metabolism of antidepressant medications. In 2003, we received funding to further develop our implementation of microarrays for diagnostic applications as well as the initiation of MRS spectroscopy studies of child and adult patients with bipolar disorder. Based on this work, we have filed a patent describing a genotypically informed methodology for the selection and dosing of antidepressant medication. Most recently, we have launched a major new effort to genotypically characterize vulnerabilities in patients, including children and adolescents, with problems in the use of substances with a specific focus on the development of genotypically informed treatments for alcoholism.
